The Coming of the Kingdom

Introduction and Overview

Summary

A good bit of confusion exists today about the nature and status of the Kingdom of God. Most Christians, of course, know *about* the Kingdom, yet *what* they know may not be adequate to help them *experience* the Kingdom, must less to *express* and *advance* it in their own life spheres. In this course we look at the coming of the Kingdom of God as it unfolds in the pages of Scripture and as it takes shape as a spiritual ecosystem of ecosystems in our lives and times.

Rationale

The calling of every Christian is to the Kingdom and glory of God (1 Thess. 2.12). Jesus commands all His followers to seek the Kingdom and righteousness of God as the highest priority and defining motif of every aspect of their lives (Matt. 6.33). He promises that the Kingdom is something we can *see* as it unfolds in righteousness, peace, and joy in the Holy Spirit in all our relationships, roles, and responsibilities (Mk. 9.1; Rom. 14.17, 18). The Kingdom of God exists not merely in *words* but in *power* to make us witnesses for Jesus Christ and ambassadors of His realm (1 Cor. 4.20; Acts 1.8; 2 Cor. 5.20). Whenever we pray, we are to pray for the coming of God's Kingdom on earth as it is in heaven (Matt. 6.10).

Thus, unless we *understand* the Kingdom and its coming, we will neither *desire* nor *seek* it as we should. This course intends to equip us with the understanding we require to fulfill our Kingdom-and-glory calling from the Lord.

Course overview

In this course you will:

- 1. Discover the Biblical basis, design, and progress of the Kingdom of God;
- 2. Learn the disciplines essential for seeking the Kingdom of God;
- 3. Discover the beauty and complexity of the Kingdom as a system of spiritual ecosystems;
- 4. Understand why the Gospel of the Kingdom is such Good News;
- 5. Explain to others the nature of the Kingdom and help them begin seeking it for themselves.

We will pursue these objectives through a varied approach to learning, including brief video presentations, interaction with Scripture, readings and discussions, assessments and written exercises, interaction with prayer partners and other believers, and regular tutorials with a Course Guide.

Introduction

Welcome

The Coming of the Kingdom explores the Biblical teaching about the nature, design, implementation, and progress of the Kingdom of God on earth as it is in heaven.

Jesus proclaimed the Gospel *of the Kingdom*. In our day this Good News has become overshadowed by a gospel which in a variety of forms focuses on the needs and interests of people, rather than the promises and agenda of God. This course provides a Biblical theology of the Kingdom, which then serves as a basis for entering, experiencing, and expressing the Kingdom in every area of our lives, from the depths of our soul to the far people and culture of our times.

Format

This course unfolds around the following activities:

Presentation: Each lesson includes at least one brief online video.

Studies in Scripture: This course features a series of studies on the unfolding of the Kingdom of God throughout Scripture. By examining the "Kingdom visionaries" of each age of divine revelation, we see how God prepared the way for the coming of Jesus, Who brought the Kingdom near and poured it out into human history by the giving of His Spirit. As we look at the way Christ is presented in the book of Psalms, our vision of His Kingdom and rule will be greatly enlarged and enhanced.

Practical exercises: Each lesson includes one or more "next steps" practical exercises, focused on that lesson. In addition, you will be asked to secure a prayer partner to meet with and pray for you as you proceed through this course. You will have many opportunities to share with your prayer partner what you are learning about the Kingdom of God.

Readers and Discussions: Each student is assigned a Reader to review course assignments. Students may also participate in optional monthly online discussions regarding the course.

Each Lesson in the course is presented in several parts. You can do as many parts as you like at a time, but you should try to **finish an entire lesson in one week**. The assignments are prepared to allow you to spend a little time each day working through the material of the course. You need not do them daily, but we recommend you try to finish each lesson within a week, to keep on pace for the course. At the end of every three Lessons, complete the brief Review Exam, and send it to your Reader. You will not be able to go on to the next Lesson until the current Review Exam is sent.
